

Michael N. Oxman, MD

Dr. Oxman is a Professor of Medicine and Pathology at the University of California, San Diego and a Staff Physician in the Infectious Diseases Section at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in San Diego.

He is currently a Fellow of the Infectious Diseases Society of America and a member of the American Society for Virology, the American Society for Microbiology, the Society for General Microbiology, the American Society for Clinical Investigation, and the Defense Health Board. Dr. Oxman is the National Chairman of VA Cooperative Study #403: "The Shingles Prevention Study".

Dr. Oxman's major research interests have been the mechanism of action of Interferon, the control of SV40 and Adenovirus-SV40 hybrid virus gene expression, and the pathogenesis, diagnosis, treatment and prevention of viral diseases, especially diseases caused by members of the Herpesvirus family.

Dr. Oxman received his bachelor's degree from Harvard University and his medical degree from Harvard Medical School. He has played a significant role in training and mentoring physician-scientists at Harvard and the University of California, and in the use of double-blind placebo-controlled clinical trials to evaluate the treatment of herpes simplex and varicella-zoster virus infections. He has authored more than 130 book chapters and articles in peer-reviewed scientific journals.
