# **Opening Remarks and the Value of Vaccines**

# Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) Recommendations and Updates

The use of licensed vaccines in the US is based on recommendations by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This presentation will address the review process (including an evidence-based methodology), recent updates to US immunization recommendations, and disease surveillance to measure the public health impact of vaccine recommendations.

# **Preventing Respiratory Diseases**

This session will provide updates on the prevention of respiratory diseases including influenza (flu), RSV, and COVID-19, focusing on vaccination and immunization strategies across the lifespan. Presentations include:

- RSV Updates

# Protecting Children and Adolescents: The Importance of Immunization

This session will focus on the critical role of immunization in protecting the health of children and adolescents, providing updates on current recommended vaccination schedules and strategies to increase vaccine coverage and confidence. Presentations include:

### The Value of Adult Immunization

# **Preventing Pneumococcal Disease through Vaccination**

Streptococcus pneumoniae colonize the nasopharynx, commonly causing local upper and lower respiratory infections including community-acquired pneumonia, and somewhat less commonly leading to invasive disease. This presentation will discuss current recommendations for pneumococcal vaccination in the US, the impact of pneumococcal conjugate vaccines on the incidence of disease in children and adults, and the role of community protection provided by pneumococcal vaccination.

# **Managing Outbreaks through Vaccination**

In recent years, the US has faced outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases beyond COVID-19, including pertussis (whooping cough), measles, and avian influenza (bird flu). This presentation will include a brief update on current outbreaks and how vaccination can help manage and prevent outbreaks.

This presentation will review the epidemiology, clinical strategies, and evidence for vaccine protection for a variety of preventable diseases associated with international travel.

This session will focus on practical strategies to boost vaccine confidence and increase vaccination rates, addressing the important role of healthcare professionals in building trust, addressing barriers, and effectively communicating with patients.
