



PNEUMOCOCCAL DISEASE

Among those at higher risk for pneumococcal disease, an NFID survey found that less than half (44%) plan to get a pneumococcal vaccine

RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS (RSV)

An NFID survey found that nearly half (44%) of those adults recommended for RSV vaccination do not plan to or are unsure they will get an RSV vaccine
